As we reflect on the past year, I'm filled with gratitude for your support of our mission. Together, we have made significant strides in empowering young adults who are preparing to exit the foster care system, providing them with the tools and resources necessary to build independent and fulfilling lives.

Our ultimate goal is to significantly reduce the foster care to homeless pipeline in South Central Texas. You'll see that our housing programs have grown by 40% in the last year, showcasing the overwhelming need for this service. THRU Project is unique in that it offers college and vocational housing to young adults who have exited foster care, equipping them with skills that increase the likelihood of earning a livable wage after leaving our program.

In Texas, approximately 1,000 youth exit foster care each year, many without permanent family connections, leading to increased risks of homelessness and instability. In response, we are committed to:

- Expanding our mentorship programs to reach more young adults in need of guidance and support.
- Establishing additional housing partnerships to meet the increasing demand for this program.
- Implementing workforce development programs to help young adults achieve their career goals and maintain employment.
- Strengthening partnerships with local organizations and businesses to create a more comprehensive support network.

None of this would be possible without your generosity and belief in our mission. Your contributions have directly impacted the lives of the young adults we serve, offering them hope and a pathway to a brighter future. OUR IMPACT

In 2024, we provided support to 380 youth throughout the year.


Approximately 80% of our participants are over the age of 18, while most of those under 18 are connected to our Heart Gallery. This year, we expanded our reach through our housing programs, increasing the number of college students we serve. As in 2023, 3% of our youth successfully graduated from college. Among our participants—excluding those in the Heart Gallery—78% are either on track to graduate high school or have already earned their diploma.




Similarly to 2023, only 9% of our clients are not in permanent housing. The other 91% of participants are in foster care, permanent housing solutions, or in our housing programs.

The employment rate among our young adults saw a slight decrease in 2024 compared to 2025. Recognizing this trend, THRU Project is launching a workforce development program to support young adults in securing meaningful employment. This initiative will provide job preparation, job-seeking assistance, and resources for maintaining employment. While 35% of our youth were unemployed, slightly more than half of them were enrolled in school, highlighting the challenges some face in balancing academics and work.






Ethnicities of all clients served in 2024.




Highest Level of Education



As a funded partner of the Heart Galleries of Texas network, the Heart Gallery of South Central Texas coordinates efforts across Region 8 with a total of 28 counties in our service area. We leverage impactful partnerships and coordinate across the child welfare system to serve as a gateway to permanency for children in the Texas Adoption Resource Exchange (TARE), to provide community education about foster care and adoption, to support partners with resources, and to increase our reach and sustainability to ensure the success of this initiative.

What started with just a few participants has grown over the years, highlighting the profound impact a trusted adult's support and guidance can have on a young person's life.



Our mentors are the cornerstone of this program, offering continuous support to the youth with whom they're matched. In 2024, we had 228 dedicated volunteer mentors participate in the program. This year's volunteers contributed more than 1,880 hours mentoring youth with backgrounds in foster care. The success of this program is possible through their dedication to our mission.



THRU Project hosts life skills workshops all year round. These sessions provide essential skills for successfully navigating adulthood. Community partners, who are specialists in the relevant topics, share their knowledge with young participants.

PASS TO SUCCESS

We offer youth six-month VIA bus passes to assist with transportation needs. Additionally, we provide Uber rides for youth to reach any events related to the THRU Project.

FOSTERING CONNECTIONS

Through a partnership with T-Mobile, we provide youth with cell phones at no cost to them. For many, this device is their sole means of accessing the internet and maintaining connections with friends, family, and community resources.

Four out of every five youth with a history of foster care are diagnosed with serious mental health concerns. Youth have access to occupational therapy, individual counseling, and support groups at no cost through BreakTHRU. As a result, youth who participate will experience improved mental wellbeing.

HOUSING

THRU Project offers 3 different housing programs: Supervised Independent Living (SIL), College Housing, and Vocational Housing. THRU Project covers rent and provides furnishings while young adults focus on their education and employment. Housing participants receive ongoing support from their Housing Resource Coordinators.

In 2024, we provided housing for 84 young adults, with 15 in SIL, 13 in Vocational Housing, and 56 in College Housing.
